Locals know best, so in conjunction with Malaysia Day, we find out what Malaysians from each state, and the Federal Territory of Kuala Lumpur, would recommend to tourists visiting their home state or hometown.

"Mulu Caves is a must-visit, especially when you want to experience nature. Explore the beauty of the caves, hike along the trails of Mount Mulu and swim in the clear water. I have been there three times and it still mesmerises me to this day.  
"If I were to choose my favourite food, it would be midin. Often I would ask the stalls to cook it for me as it is common in Sarawak for people to bring the raw ingredients they bought from the market straight to a stall.  
"Aside from that, I also enjoy having umai and I love Sarawak's style of asam pedas with terung asam."

## SELANGOR

"Start the tour with a visit to the Forest Reserve in Kepong to explore the bountiful ecosystem. Next, head to Kuala Selangor to visit the Lighthouse or Bukit Jugra, go for some seafood and firefly watching in the evening.  
"For adventurous travellers, go on a cycling tour. One of my favourite locations is Hulu Langat.  
"My go-to places when hunger hits is nasi lemak at Medan Selera Jalan 223; Jackson Burger in PJ Section 14 (you have to go for their crab burger!); Restoran Subang Ria, Kelana Jaya for kuey teow goreng and yong tau foo.  
"For cool desserts, the ais kacang or cendol at Kwong Wah in Section 17 never disappoints. For high tea sessions, Cake Jalan Tiung in Shah Alam will satisfy your sweet tooth cravings."

## JOHOR

"Johor Baru is a place where you can find almost everything that could cater to one's diverse interests.  
"To those who value family bonding time, there are many theme parks available. If you are interested in heritage, architecture and culture, I recommend the Heritage Trails of Johor Baru, which covers the High Court Building, Sultan Ibrahim Building, Jalan Bahru Chinese Heritage Museum, Jalan Tan Hioh Nee and Jalan Wong Ah Fook, among others.  
"Johor also offers a variety of food to choose from. Some places I would recommend are RZ Restoran (for sambal udang galah and ikan baung masak lemak) and Nasir Corner (ikan baung lemak cilipadi) in my hometown of Segamat."



## PERAK


