LARGEST BY FAR: Bintulu Port handled the largest Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) vessel named 'Vasant 1' which berthed at the port on November 1. The vessel, with tank capacity of 180,000 cubic metres is the largest LNG vessel ever berthed at the port so far. The vessel is operated by Nippon India Ship Management Pvt Ltd and is chartered by Petronas to carry its LNG to buyers across the region. The vessel which was loaded with 135,000 cubic metres of LNG safely departed Bintulu Port on Tuesday, and is now heading to its next port of call in Mergui, Myanmar.
