

Updates on the Avifauna Community at Ulu Muda Forest Reserve and its Adjacent, Kedah

Introduction

- Ulu Muda Forest Reserve (UMFR) is located in Kedah with more than 104,000ha in size, that runs along the state's eastern interior border with Thailand's Yala province.
- UMFR is known as home for large mammals including elephants and tapirs; and also one of the hotspots for bird enthusiasts in the state.
 Species like Oriental darter, Osprey, Rhinoceros and Plain-pouched hombills can be observed either along the Sg Muda or in its adjacent forest.
- UMFR is recognized as an Important Bird and Biodiversity Area (IBA) by Birdlife International.
- This paper is demonstrating an update on the avifauna community at UMFR and its adjacent forest areas.

Materials and Methods

Mist netting

 10 mist nets were deployed at each compartment namely Compartments 104, 105, 127, and 128.

Direct Observations

 Were carried out at Pedu Forest Reserve, Tasik Muda and along Sungai Muda by using binoculars and cameras.



CONCLUSION

 From 49 families, Muscicapidae (16 spp), Pycnonotidae (11 spp), and Alcedinidae (10 spp) were recorded as most abundance at Ulu Muda, Kedah.
